

## Working to achieve the Millennium Development Goals

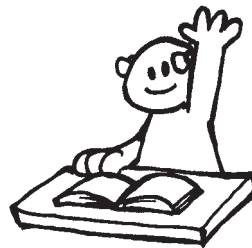
You will need to watch the video/DVD about Bangladesh and read Farid's story before completing this worksheet.

Remember, Farid's story and the DVD should help to give you some ideas.

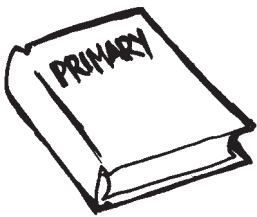
1. Cut out the different pieces below.
2. On your own, decide which items you think are the most important for Bangladesh. (Remember you only have \$100 million to spend).
3. Then share your decision with a partner. (Remember to explain why you have made your selection).
4. In small groups repeat Step 3.
5. Whole class discussion – as a class select the most important items and explain why you have chosen them.
6. Paste the class' selection of items into your book. How did this differ from your selection in Step 1? Do you agree with what the class selected? Why?/Why not?



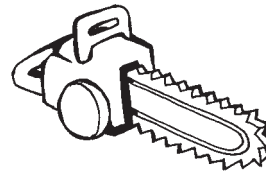

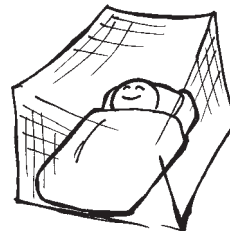
