RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES



Learning Intention: To understand the role of subsidiarity as a right in accordance with Church teaching and scripture.

ACTIVITY

- 1. What is the difference between a right and responsibility?
- 2. What have you heard in the news lately about the violations of human rights in different parts of the world?
- 3. Over time, the Catholic Church has released, and continues to release, encyclicals on various issues that exist in our world. It provides a guide on how we should address these issues as a Church and global community. These encyclicals often identify important rights that must be upheld and defended in the preservation of human dignity. Most of these rights align closely with those present in the Universal Declaration of Human rights.

Below is a list of some of these rights. In groups of no more than 4, select the NINE rights you believe are most important, and rank them in order from most important to least important. You may want to write them down on pieces of paper so you can easily change the order around.

The right to food (RN #4, 10)

The right to shelter and private property (RN #5) The right to a just living and wage (RN #34, LE #19)

The right to rest (LE #19)

The right to life and a worthy standard of living (PT #11)

The right to moral and cultural values
(PT #12-13)

The right to development (JM # 15)

The right to emigrate and immigrate

(PT #25)

The right to worship according to one's conscience; the right to religious freedom

(DH #13)

The right to freedom of expression and thought

(JM #44)

The right to a pension in old age, sickness or injury (LE #19) The right to social security connected to maternity
(LE# 19)

The right to choose the kind of life which appeals such as founding a family or embracing religious life

The right to a work that is not harmful to one's health or their moral integrity. (LE #19)

The right of workers to form unions; the right to assemble and form associations (RN #38, QA #23) The right to appropriate subsidies for unemployed workers and their families
