Why Global Social Justice?

Poverty and injustice are created by the actions of people. This means they can be eradicated - it's not a question of if, but when. But for this to happen, we must all work together towards the creation of a more just and fair world.

GSJ and the Curriculum

The whole person and the context of a global society are critical elements of education. They are also embedded in the Australian curriculum.

We work towards a more just and fair world not out of charity or goodwill, but because we believe it is a necessary response to the Gospel call of Jesus, and a matter of justice. Importantly, if this response is central to our faith, then it is also central to every Catholic school's identity, which should demonstrate the value it holds for the dignity of the human person, a preferred culture of community and its commitment to social justice and service for the common good.
